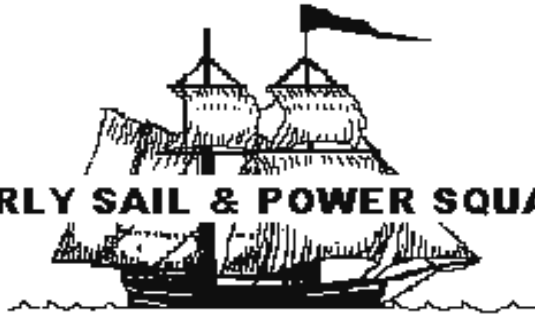

FROM THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER

BOAT OPERATORS CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

At the Boat Operators Certification Program seminar held at the Four District Conference in Woods Hole, November 12th, I learned that the United States Coast Guard has asked Congress to authorize the Transportation Secretary to establish requirements for standards of proficiency for recreational boaters.

The United States Power Squadron intends to have USPS certification be accepted as proof of proficiency and as the national certificate for the USA. At this point, four levels of Boat Operator Certification for USPS are being planned, ranging from Inland Navigator to Offshore Navigator.

One of the advantages of certification include recognition of skills when chartering a boat, especially in another country. The plan is to be certain USPS certification meets or exceeds the requirements of UN Resolution 40, *International Certificate for the Operation of Pleasure Craft*".

The certifiers must be trained and certified first in a program that includes demonstration of on-the-water skills. I hope to present the details of the exciting program at a future Squadron meeting.

Looking forward to seeing you at the January meeting. We need *all* of you to keep the important USPS educational programs going for current and future boaters.

ACTION ALERT!

CALL OR WRITE YOUR US REPRESENTATIVE AND US SENATOR IN WASHINGTON!

House Bill H.R. 2550 is to amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act relating to recreational vessels. It should be passed in order to to exempt recreational boater from the permitting process meant for cargo and cruise ships. It relates to all water discharge from your boat, including deck runoff.

This bill is in the first step in the legislative process. It was introduced May 24, 2007, and referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment on May 24, 2007.

Introduced bills go first to committees that deliberate, investigate, and revise them before they go to general debate. The majority of bills never make it out of committee (Last update online was Dec 9, 2007)

The related bill in the Senate is S2067: Recreational Boating Act of 2007. It is in the same stage of the process.

This is an open Blog and I would encourage everyone to read it. I have taken some excerpts from one entry for you.

The Day I Started Loving Elias

- ◆ When he stopped me from stepping across a driveway where a car was backing out, even though the car was still several feet away from the sidewalk.
- ◆ When he took me across a street and showed me a police car that had pulled over a speeder, as if to say, "Here is someone watching out for people's safety, just as I am doing for you."
- ◆ When he followed my commands, even though my voice was next-to-absent due to a bad cold.

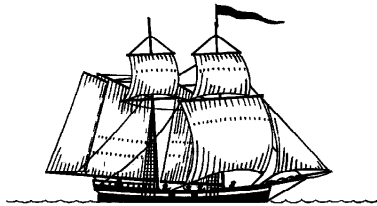
